ation, a voluntary "fellowship" association. In Singapore, members of the International

Relations Committee of The Law Society of Singapore hosted a very congenial luncheon for my wife and me at the very impressive edifice housing the Singapore Academy of Law and the Singapore Supreme Court. . The Law Society has approximately 2,600 members. Also, while in Singapore, we met with the president of the Inter-Pacific Bar Association, Parhanaban Selvadura, at his law office.

In Hong Kong, meetings took place with executives of The Bar Association of Hone Kong (the barristers' group) and the much larger group, The Law Society of Hong Kong (the solicitor's group), where we also had the opportunity to have candid conversations about the future of the Hong Kong legal com-

munity after July.
